



ATM DISPENSER FRAUD

ATM Dispenser Fraud occurs when cybercriminals manipulate ATM machines to wrongly dispense cash or capture card details. This can happen through hardware tampering. Victims often lose money directly from their accounts without any card misuse.

What To Look Out For When Using ATMs

Keypad Overlay

- A Keypad overlay, is use to capture customer PINs by storing keystrokes in the phony keypad's circuitry.
- Inspect the ATM keypad for loose keypad or irregular shape keypad.

Hidden Camera

- A concealed camera, often concealed above the ATM screen or near a light fixture, is used to record customers PIN.
- Check the ATM screen before use.

Cash trapping

- Hidden-trap theft: Criminals fit a device in an ATM cash slot to catch dispensed notes so you receive nothing.
- Check for loose/odd parts, repeated "no cash dispensed" errors or delayed card return.

Quick Tips

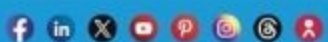
- Use your hand to cover the view when entering your PIN to take out cash
- Always check the ATM for any suspicious activity before making a transaction
- If you notice that any parts of the ATM appear unusual, do not use it
